



For my physical recreation I chose Taekwondo with my local club. Taekwondo and other martial arts are a great choice for Gaisce as you can really see your progress over the 13 weeks by moving up in belts. For my personal skill I decided to learn Polish on Duolingo. A language is a great option for Gaisce as it is easily accessible with apps like Duolingo, and you can learn useful phrases!

For my community involvement I volunteered coaching with the u9 team in Dunmanway RFC.

For me this was a great way to give back to my club while improving my own skills and even getting my IRFU Active Coach Badge.

For my hike me and three other girls from my unit hiked from Inchigeela to Macroom on the first day and then north of Macroom on the second day.

For me Gaisce was a great way to get involved in my local community and grow my own skills. I have since started my silver Gaisce award which is 26 weeks instead of thirteen. I would recommend getting involved in Gaisce to anyone who is interested!

### INDOOR SEASON OF SCIATH NA SCOL

There was a veritable feast of Primary school hurling, camogie and football held over the last 5 weeks at a myriad of venues all around Cork as boys and girls from 3rd and 4th classes participated in Indoor Hurling, Indoor Camogie, Indoor football for girls and Indoor football for boys.

Incidentally the Indoor Football goes by the name of 'Peil Faoi Dhíon' which translates as Football under the roof.

Organised by the Sciath na Scol committee and led by Mark O' Driscoll (Scoil Oilibhéir, Ballyvolane) it is a logistical masterclass. The numbers participating are astounding and are growing year on year.

All in all there were over 4,000 boys and girls participating this year!

So while pitches were closed all over the county and not enough astros to go around for training, Primary schools gaelic games carried on as the sports halls around the county were a hive of activity with boys and girls as young as 8 years of age and up to 10 getting, in most cases, their first ever experience of playing in a Sciath na Scol competition and representing their schools in many cases for the very first time.

This gave them a taste of what to expect in Sciath competitions later in their Primary School lives, when they get into 5th and 6th classes with several lucky children ending up in a final in Páirc Uí Chaoimh,a golden memory for them for life.

But that is later and for now 4,000 children were swinging their hurleys or kicking the ball in the indoor events. In recent years, Sciath has offered

both competitive and non-competitive events. Non-competitive offers a stress free, enjoyment

based platform for children to represent their school, play against other schools and without the pressure of winning.

The non-competitive has been gaining popularity in recent years and this year nearly half of schools opted to go into the non-competitive event but the choice remains for both competitive and noncompetitive so schools can decide for themselves what way they want to go with it, with some preferring the competitive bite that the traditional competitions give.

In the competitive sections, the Hurling League was won by Kildorrery with the Camogie premier going to Scoil Chrol Íosa and the Premier Hurling going to Riverstown NS.

Berrings won the Hurling Championship and Scoil Mhairtín, Kilworth won the Camogie Championship. Matches took place in Little Island. Mallow, Ballinacarriga, Whitechurch, Nemo Rangers, Donoughmore, Bishopstown and Na Piarsaigh with Sciath na Scol very grateful to these clubs for giving their venues over for the festival of gaelic games.







WHAT IS THE CROI CONAITHE VACANT & DERELICT PROPERTY GRANT?

Regenerating and rejuvenating our cities, towns and villages is key to thriving communities. The Croi Conaithe Vacant and Derelict Property Grant is a direct state support for

homebuyers and homeowners to refurbish a vacant or derelict property and turn it into a home. The grant can be used to renovate properties that have not been used as residential properties before. The scheme was originally designed for people who wanted to turn a vacant or derelict property into their principle primary residence. It has now been extended to include the renovation of properties for rental.

Grants of €50,000 - or €70,000 if the property is derelict - are available from Cork County Council and from local authorities all across the country. If you would like further information about these grants, or if you would like to make an application, I would be happy to help you in any way I can.

People applying for the Croi Conaithe Scheme may also be eligible for up to €28,000 in SEAI Home Energy Upgrade grants. Further information is available at https://www.seal.ie/grants/home-energy-grants/

Cork County Council administers the Individual Domestic Well Grants to assist households in rural areas that are dependent on a private water supply (individual well) for their household use, by financially assisting them where they incur capital expenditure, to carry out improvements to the supply to ensure that the water supply is wholesome and clean, or that the quantity supplied is insufficient to meet the domestic needs of the household.

You are eligible to apply for grant assistance if your house is over 7 years old, If you have not received grant assistance for Domestic Water Supply within the last 7 years, if you are not connected to a public water supply or cannot be reasonably served by a public or group water supply scheme source and if the house is occupied as your normal place of resi-

### **GRANT FUNDING:**

(a) 85% of the approved costs for well rehabilitation works, subject to a maximum grant of €3,000 or 85% of the approved costs for the provision of a new well, subject to a maximum

(b) 100% of the approved costs for works that, in the opinion of the housing authority, are necessary to treat the water to meet the water quality standards specified in Regulation 4(2) of the Drinking Water Regulations, subject to a maximum grant of €1,000. A grant under these Regulations shall not be paid where the total cost is less than €750. I would be happy to help you apply for any of the above grant schemes.

### DO YOU KNOW YOU CAN EARN UP TO €35,000 A YEAR

(and more for couples)

### AND STILL QUALIFY FOR SOCIAL HOUSING OR HOUSING **ASSISTANCE PAYMENT?**

The income eligibility threshold for a single person applying to Cork County Council has increased from €30,000 to €35,000. The allowances are increased by 5% for each adult household member (subject to a maximum of 10%) and 2.5% for each child.

The thresholds for sample household compositions are set out in the table below:

Single Adult €35,000

2 Adults: €36,750

1 Adult + 1 Child: €35,875

1 Adult + 2 Children: €36,750

2 Adults + 1 Child: €37,625

2 Adults + 3 Children: €39,375

3 Adults + 4 Children: €42,000

Applications assessed and decided upon prior to January 1. 2023, which were deemed to exceed the thresholds at that time, but which may meet the new income thresholds, can be resubmitted by applicants.

### HOUSING ADAPTATION GRANT FOR PEOPLE WITH A DISABILITY

This is a grant for people with a disability to make the home more suitable to the individual's needs. You can use this grant to make your home more accessible by:

- Adding ramps or other ways to access your home
- Extending your home to create more space, for example, adding a downstairs bedroom
- Adding accessible bathroom facilities, such as an accessible shower or a ground-floor bathroom or toilet
- Installing a stair lift
- Installing grab rails
- Installing a fixed track hoist.

(This is a ceiling or wall-mounted track with a sling attached to it, which means you can be mechanically lifted and moved to different places along the track).

The grant does not cover VAT on the work. However, you can apply to Revenue for a VAT refund for any appliances that you need and the cost of installing them.

#### WHO CAN APPLY?

A person with a disability who requires adaptation works to make a house more suitable for their accommodation needs, or a homeowner on behalf of a person with a disability who is a member of

- Gross annual household income must not exceed €60,000.
- Maximum grant of €30,000 to cover up to 95% of the cost of works may be available to applicants with gross household incomes of up to €30,000 per annum, tapering to 30% for applicants with gross household incomes of between €50,000-€60,000 per annum.
- Applications are prioritised on medical needs.

Priority 1: A person who is terminally III or fully dependent, where alterations or adaptations would facilitate the discharge from hospital or prevent the need for hospitalisation.

Priority 2: A person who is mobile but who needs assistance, and without adaptations or alterations their independence would be hindered.

Priority 3: A person who is independent but requires special facilities to improve their quality of life.

### GRANT SCHEME TO REPLACE LEAD PIPES AND FITTINGS

To qualify for the Domestic Lead Remediation Grant, the lead pipes and fittings being replaced must be part of a system that carries water for preparing food or drinks, or for direct human consumption. The grant covers 100% of the qualifying work up to €5,000, If it costs less than €750 to replace the pipes, you will not qualify for the grant. You can include the cost of getting proof from a laboratory or registered building professional that you have lead pipes, up to a maximum of €200. This grant is not means tested.

### SEPTIC TANK GRANTS

From January 1, 2024, grants available for septic tanks (Domestic Water Treatment Systems) have been increased from €5,000 to €12,000. The previous requiremenet for the septic tank to have been registered with the local authority before February 2013 has now been removed. The changes mean that more households will qualify for the grants. There are 3 different schemes. One grant is available for people to upgrade or repair their system following an inspection. The other two grants are only available if you live in a particular area, and are notified by your local authority that you are eligible to apply. Further information is available at www.gove.ie.

### **DEVELOPMENT LEVIES**

At the moment, developers and builders are not required to pay development levies to local authorities for the infrastructure required to connect new homes with roads, water and other services such as footpaths. This is saving an average of €12,650 on the cost of building a new home.

### HOUSING AID FOR OLDER PEOPLE GRANT

Available to assist people aged 66 and older, who are living in poor housing conditions to have necessary repairs or improvements carried out. In genuine cases of hardship, grants may be available to help people under the age of 66.

This grant is means tested. Applicants will be assessed on the basis of all household income, that is, the annual gross income of all household members aged 18 years or over (or aged 23 years or over if in full time education) in the previous tax

The effective maximum grant under the scheme is €8,000, which may cover up to 95% of the approved cost of works in the case of an applicant with a gross household income of up to €30,000 per annum. The level of grant allocated will taper to 30% of the cost of works for applicants with gross household incomes of between €50,001 to €60,000 per annum.

### MOBILITY AID GRANT

The scheme is for older people and people with disabilities.

The mobility aid grant can be used to make basic changes to your home, so it is more accessible.

Up to a maximum grant of €6,000, which may cover 100% of the cost of the works, may be available to applicants with gross household incomes of up to €30,000 per annum.

'Note - The grant does not cover VAT on the work. However, you can apply to Revenue for a VAT refund on any appliances you need and the cost of installing them.

### ALONE

More than 160 members from 28 of the Active retirement associations in Cork and Kerry attended the AGM of the Southern Region of Active Retirement Ireland in Killarney on the 28th February. Six were from our association. After getting through the business of the day and the questions and answer session and before the lunch we had a talk from three officers from ALONE in the South West. It was excellent. ALONE do much more than what they are best known for, their befriending service. There are many who avail of their telephone service and they help out too with all sort of practical matters such as grant applications for home modifications that may have become necessary. In fact, they introduce people to all sorts of supports that we may not have heard or been aware of. The purpose of their presentation was to make us aware of the extent of the service and also to encourage us to consider using it or to volunteer as the befriender. They pointed out that the benefits are significantly life enhancing to both parties to the relationship. I can attest to that. I became a volunteer with ALONE just over two years ago. After the training sessions I was paired with a man in the city. They knew what they were doing and we had a host of similar interests. At the first meeting, we got carried away, time flew. After about two hours covering a wide range of topics, we realised that we were both tired. So, we agreed that we would limit ourselves to an hour in future and so we did weekly. I understand that some men like to solve problems, while some women are often more interested in us men acknowledging that they have them (often us!). They know that they are well capable of solving them themselves. I am a man that have either enough problems at all times, or if they are ever running low, I can manufacture them very easily. So, it came to pass that my man quickly became my mentor and my friend. He would give his wisdom and to my surprise he would enhance that wisdom the following week as he contemplated over the week. As happens the problem may have disappeared, but he ensured

that the learning was engrained.

About 11 months after meeting him I went in as usual, but the door that he always had left open for me at the appointed time was closed. Naturally I was a bit concerned. But in no lenght of time a neighbour came out and said that man is dead and buried a few days ago.

Good friends are a rare enough blessing especially for men. I grieved my loss, as many friends and carers do, privately and silently. It is hardly surprising, I suppose, that just an hour a week every week can lead to deep friendship. I reported to ALONE as I was required to do. An excellent organisation they are. Within a few days I got a card expressing sympathy from them. They consult regularly with their volunteers and had obviously learned from them. I was told to take as long as I needed before I decided to offer myself for pairing again. I did need that.

I can't recommend that you should volunteer with ALONE. We are all so different and you may have had too much loss in your life already to risk more. On the other hand, for me it was certainly a life enhancing experience. So I would recommend only that you consider it.

Our Coffee crawl on Wednesday 21st February ended up at the Killumney Inn. The twenty that travelled were very happy with the welcome and service. Thank you. We are planning the next one for Wednesday 20th March. We intend to continue our coffee crawl one Wednesday each month until our summer break.

On Tuesday 27th we had a talk in the Independence room Kilmurry by Dermot Cronin from Muintir na Tire on engraving valuables so that they can be identified and returned to you if recovered after theft, and to discourage theft. He spoke about 'Cairde' their app now that they use for the neighbourhood watch and much else besides. It has a feature that works like the traditional red button. It sends a message to your designated people if you need help with a map indicating where you were when the message was sent. Some may be more inclined to carry a phone with the app installed than

a red button, though the button has its advantages too. Choice is good.

Welcome back dear student, well Spring is here, the season of new life and growth. Time sure passes quickly! The late songwriter Jim Croce wrote the beautiful 'Time In A Bottle' many years ago, yet his message still rings true'...there never seems to be enough time to do the things you want to do'. Solomon wrote, "There is a season, a time appointed, for everything..." (Ecclesiastes 3:1). God's Word guides one into a life of purpose, hope and harvest! (Jeremiah 29:11). Paul gave this advice... "see that you walk carefully, living life with honour, purpose, and courage; shunning those who tolerate and enable evil, not as the unwise, but as wise - sensible, intelligent, discerning people, making the very most of your time on earth, recognising and taking advantage of each opportunity and using it with wisdom and diligence, because the days are filled with evil. Therefore, do not be foolish and thoughtless, but understand and firmly grasp what the will of the Lord is" (Ephesians 5:15-17 Amplified Bible). Most people will aim to fulfil this Word in their lifetime, but without knowing the God's Word, it is difficult to do.

David wrote "my times are in Your hands" (Psalms 31:15). He learned to lean upon God in tough times and saw the Lord's hand move him from obscurity on a hillside minding sheep, to leading the nation of Israel as King. Last week we spoke of how some people find it hard to sleep because of anxious thoughts. You can face anything when you've had a good night's rest. It's not just our 'awake' time that we can place in God's hands though - we should also give Him our sleep time (Psalm 4:8). God speaks to us in dreams and visions of the night, but the enemy also tries to use it as an opportunity to disturb our rest by troubling the mind. Days, months, and years can slip by leaving a person feeling totally exhausted and defeated. But God is Faithful! Jesus is our Redeemer (Titus 2:11-14), and He promises to restore the years the locusts have stolen (Joel 2:25). This means where time has been robbed by difficult circumstances or pain, the Lord will bring restoration when we lean in upon Him and learn to know who we are in Christ (2 Corinthians 5:17-21). Jesus told His disciples "behold I have given you authority over Satan, over his snakes and his scorpions, and over all the power of the devil, and nothing shall by any means hurt you" (Luke 10:19). The Lord was revealing His Power and the legal right to use it that He gives each believer in His Name - to trample upon the agenda and plots the devil has tried to defeat or destroy us with. God promises that when we receive Yeshua as Lord and Saviour taking refuge in His Love and His Word that we... "will tread upon the lion and cobra; the young lion and the serpent you will trample underfoot" (Psalm 91:9-13).

As St. Patrick's Day approaches, it's interesting that it was attributed to Patrick that he got rid of snakes from Ireland. The snake is a manifestation of Satan (going back to the garden of Eden) symbolising how he wickedly tricks, ensnares and poisons (Genesis 3:1-15). But God's Authority and Power that the Lord Jesus paid for with His Blood ensures that we don't have to live under the devil's deception or devastation any longer, for the demons are subject to us in Jesus' Name, and we can instead rejoice in our free gift of Salvation through Christ (Luke 10:20; Psalm 107:20).


